

LWR WANTS YOU. LWR NEEDS YOU. WHAT IS LWR?

Lutheran World Relief was founded in 1945 by U. S. Lutherans to aid in the recovery of post-war Europe. It's mission is now worldwide. Making kits of needed items for school and personal care has been a tradition of the Sunday School on Rally Day. Items were collected by the congregation over the summer and then assembled. During the pandemic families assembled their own kits. This year the Rally Day collection is pet food for Project Concern but the Social Ministry Committee wants to keep LWR in our mission. This year the Sunday School kids were asked what they thought we should collect in October and they chose the personal care kits. The requested items are listed below so you can watch the sales for towels. Do you hate to shop but like to sew? Are you blessed with bored grandchildren or friends? Think about sewing towels with them.

If you are intrigued with this opportunity, check the LWR site for other kit instructions. Quilts and fabric are a need as are baby care kits. Cloth diapers are required but there are instructions for making them from t shirts or flannel. Cost is greater but what fun to buy those tiny socks.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT (BINS WILL BE IN THE NARTHEX JUNE 10^{TH})

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended. Shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use. • Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping.

ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging. Multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope, no plastic bags or wrap. The committee can do this for you'

ONE sturdy comb.

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional.

HOW TO PACK KITS • Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string, or rubber bands. • The kids will do this if you only want to buy items.

PLEASE GIVE NEW ITEMS ONLY. • Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages, or your group's name. • Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage. • Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic ba
